



Relay rolls through Northern Territory in support of changes to constitution

THE Journey to Recognition rolled through Katherine on the weekend.

The epic relay across the country aims to build momentum to recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in Australia's Constitution.

The stop in Katherine was an opportunity to meet with Telstra representatives in the Northern

Territory, as part of the company's ongoing support of constitutional recognition of Indigenous Australians.

Telstra dealer Kevin Grey from NT Technology said it was exciting to see the journey come to Katherine, and a good opportunity to support the movement.

"The journey carries a positive message about

reconciliation and connecting all Australians in one great cause," Mr Grey said.
